

Welcome to the Bee Teaching Garden of the Community Pettendorf!

This bee teaching garden is part of the "Bee World of Experience Pettendorf" and is a joint project of the community and the local group of the Association Nature Conservation (BUND Naturschutz). In 2011, the "Fruticetum" was created together with the elementary school Pettendorf. It consists of 25 native shrubs. Since then, the area has also been used for general knowledge and local history lessons. New fruit trees have been added over the years. The development of a semi-dry grassland, by seed transfer from surrounding areas, was implemented by the local branch of Association Nature Conservation. Additional elements have been added by the community to help the wild bees find enough food and nesting options:

- Beehive and loess wall - for wild bees who like to nest in the open ground.
- Bee trough - yes, even bees are thirsty!
- Standing and lying deadwood - for wild bees who like to nest in deadwood.
- Native woody plants such as wild roses and Whitebeams - their flowers provide food.
- Cairn and dry-stone walls - this is where the bumblebees especially like to nest.
